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BASE FORM	"ING" - FORM
Cook - Eat - Speak	Cooking - Eating - Speaking
Buy - Enjoy - Try	Buying - Enjoying - Trying (Final letter "Y" is in the same place)
Go - Do	Going - Doing
Drive - Share - Write	Driving - Sharing - Writing (Final letter "E" is eliminating)
Lay - Lie	Lying - Lying
Skip* - Put* - Swim*	Skipping - Putting - Swimming

\*The final three letters are "consonant - vowel - consonant", that's why we have



## Present Continuous



**Present Continuous Affirmative**  
we use "be" + "ing" verbs

I am walking.  
She is talking.  
He is laughing.  
It is raining.  
They are singing.  
We are cooking.  
You are smiling.



**Present Continuous Negative**  
we use "be" + "not" + "ing" verbs

I am not walking.  
She is not talking.  
He is not laughing.  
It is not raining.  
They are not singing.  
We are not cooking.  
You are not smiling.



**Present Continuous Question**  
We use "be" followed by "Pronoun or subject"

Am I walking?  
Is she talking?  
Is he laughing?  
Is it raining?  
Are they singing?  
Are we cooking?  
Are you smiling?
